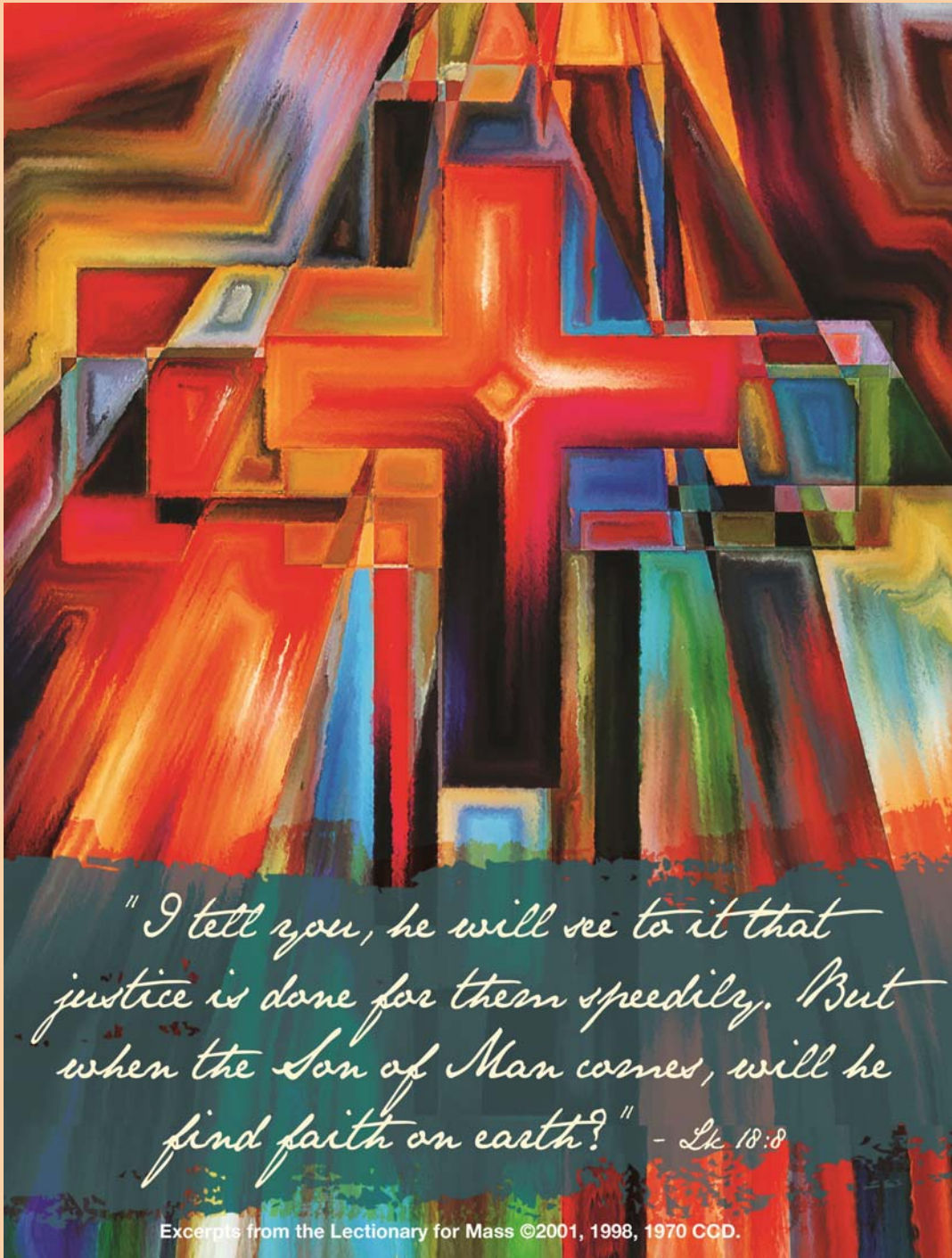

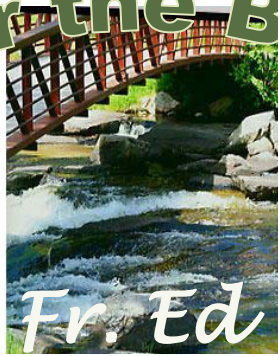

There is now a group of people organizing the same thing here in America. The United State of America, and our citizens need prayer more than ever.

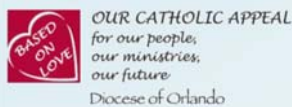

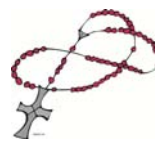
